

Southend Model Boat Club: Covid-19 Policy and Risk assessment

Coronavirus disease (Covid-19) is an infectious disease caused by a newly discovered coronavirus.

Most people infected with COVID-19 virus will experience mild to moderate respiratory illness and recover without requiring special treatment. Older people, and those with underlying medical problems like cardiovascular disease, diabetes, chronic respiratory disease and cancer are more likely to develop serious illness which may ultimately result in death.

The COVID-19 virus spreads primarily through droplets of saliva or discharge from the nose when an infected person coughs or sneezes.

At all times information on the above link takes precedence should there be any conflict with the following SMBC club actions.

1. All club members will be made aware of this policy document and associated risk assessment.
2. All club members are expected to make their own assessment of the current risk to their individual health as well as their potential impact on others health and welfare that attendance at the club event may incur before entering any event.
3. All members at a club event will be required to follow all current government guidance on Covid-19 at all times.
4. Members attendance at all club events will require pre-entry to the club secretary to ensure government guidelines on gathering sizes are not exceeded, (currently only 6 people from other household) In the event that guidelines permit gatherings larger than the known club section size the requirement for pre-entry will cease for that section.
5. Attendance at a club event without pre-entry is forbidden and any individual club member doing so will be asked to leave Southchurch Park immediately.
6. Any member that has Covi-19 symptoms, or any reason to believe they may have been exposed to anyone with symptoms must not attend any event even if pre-entry has been completed.
7. The club secretary, or other designated official, will keep a record of individuals, and their contact details, who have attended each event, for a minimum of 28 days, should it become required by NHS Test and Trace.
8. For all club events held at Southchurch Park the club will provide World Health Organisation (WHO) approved sanitiser for use by all club members.
9. No event will exceed 3 hours duration to minimise the requirement to eat and drink. If anyone needs to eat or drink due to medical reasons then they must sanitise before and after.
10. When necessary a cordoned off area will be provide for club members to occupy whilst operating models to aid social distancing from members of the general public.
11. Moving the dingy from the club hut to the lakeside shall be undertaken by a maximum of two persons. Wherever possible one of these two people to be the designated dingy user for the event. Only one person should ever enter the hut and sanitise/spray all equipment used before and after use.
12. Where it becomes necessary for a club member, other than the dingy/equipment user, to touch any club equipment hand sanitiser/spray should be used before and after doing so.
13. Disposable masks and gloves will be available if required by any club member during club meetings. After their use the club member will be responsible for their safe disposal following government guidelines.
14. On completion of the event the designated dingy user will spray all touch surfaces on equipment used with WHO approved disinfectant once it is returned to the hut a the hut locked.
15. No event will count towards any SMBC Trophy competition whilst there is a potential for any club member to be excluded as a result of UK Government guidelines.
