How to use this Risk Assessment

This risk assessment document is for the members of SMBC task leaders: It identifies the common risks associated with tasks in or near the club hut,

Common measures which are to be taken to control them. Task Leaders must use it in conjunction with SMBC Site Safety risk assessment and other club risk assessments to assist them in determine the contents of the pre-task safety talk and the organisation of activities that take place during the task.

This risk assessment must be used in conjunction with the site safety assessment and other task specific risk assessments as appropriate for the activities being carried out.

Risk assessment

Supervision required Review risk assessment and brief members on risks and controls before work starts

PPE required Protective footwear and gloves. Additional PPE or detailed below.

Members & Volunteers must not reverse in or out of the park. Members & volunteers when turning round ask another member to see them back. Members & Volunteers must not park on the footpath. Ensure that they load & unload as quickly as possible then leave the park and park on the highway. If members or Volunteers can refrain from bring vehicles into the park as this has not been agreed formally. All members to be extra vigilant when manoeuvring vehicles in the park ensure accidents are avoided 	Medium	
Lake edging walk ways & pontoon Slips / trips & Falls	Public, club members, volunteers	Medium	 Extreme care to be taken by all parties when walking around the pond as areas can be uneven ensure towpath is kept clear of obstructions. Advice members & volunteers to take particular care when launching models and use the straps provided. 	Low	

The lake	Public, club members, volunteers	High	 All members' volunteers whose models get stuck in the lake should seek the assistance of other members to retrieve their model by way of the use of the rescue pole, dingy, waders, ensuring life jackets are worn and are tethered by a rope. Members to familiarize the location of all emergency equipment. 	
Dangers of model Boats	Public, club members, volunteers	Medium	 All members and volunteers to ensure that when retrieving, launching models that both hands are kept clear of any propellers in case of inadvertent start up or radio glitch 	
Yacht masts & Transmitter Aerials	Public, club members, volunteers	Medium	Members Volunteers to ensure yacht masts are not at eye level, but laid down, Transmitter aerials to have a protector on the aerial end such a sponge	
Batteries	Public, club members, volunteers	Medium	 Members or volunteers who have cause to charge batteries in the club house must not leave them charging unattended. Great care should be taken to prevent electric shock, fire, or explosion from Lipo batteries 	
Steam Boats & Steam engines	Public, club members, volunteers	Medium	 Members & Visitors must be in possession of the relevant and up to date boiler test certificate before commencing to fire up a steam engine 	
Rescue Dingy	Public, club members, volunteers	Medium	 Any launching of club dingy must be done by two persons to carry & launch Great care should be taken when lifting the dingy across the public footpath. Users using the dingy must wear a lifejacket and it should be tethered in a way as to prevent unauthorised use. 	
Club Refreshment Facilities Kettle ,tea urn	Public, Club members, volunteers	Medium	 Members to ensure kettle and tea urn are not left on and should not be left unattended. Ensure both kettle and urn are full of fresh water. When hut is vacated ensure all sockets and plugs are switched off and plugs removed. 	
Club Tables & Gazebo's	Public, Club members, volunteers	Medium	 Members to ensure that tables are set up correctly and on level ground on the club patio. Gazebo's should be tethered correctly especially during windy conditions, guy ropes need to be highlighted with high visibility tape to prevent, public & members tripping over them

Determine Procedure Below

- 1. No lone person to be in the club hut a minimum of two required
- 2. Only competent members and volunteers to use the club hut facility's
- 3. Ensure the hut is kept clean and tidy at all times
- 4. No unauthorised equipment boats electrical equipment to be left in the hut without permission of a committee member.
- 5. Personal hygiene whilst working in / near water cover cuts with waterproof dressing, wash hands, use sanitizer before touching face or other bodily parts, eating or smoking.
- 6. Ensure all members / volunteers are informed that if they are exposed to water via cuts, openings in the body or ingestion that if they feel unwell to seek medical advice immediately and enter details in the accident book.
- 7. Issue HSE guidance to leptospirosis (Weils disease) to members who work in the water.
- 8. All members working must wear a lifejacket or suitable buoyancy aid when working from the boat or wading in the water in waders using the dingy or setting out courses
- 9. All appropriate PPE, rescue & safety equipment must be used where required i.e. Throw line, gloves, ropes, first aid kit, buoyancy aids or life jackets.
- 10. Ensure all PPE is in good order and tested where appropriate.
- 11. Rescue equipment should be located where it can be quickly / easily reached and used including fire extinguishers
- 12. All members who use the equipment must report any problems defects with equipment such as kettle, tea urn, fire extinguishers or display equipment to the committee immediately
- 13. If emergency services are required please quote post code details for reference (Southchurch park, West Entrance, Kensington Road, SS1 2 SX)
- 14. A first Aid kit is provided for in the hut minor cuts and abrasions.
